Introduction

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Provision

Following a self-review and a staff skills audit the following objectives have been agreed:

- Provide release time for our PE Subject Leader and other specialist trained staff to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across the school.
- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities.
- Improve our resources and facilities to support the development of the subject.
- Added resources and equipment to support Lower KS2 children in inter-competition activities and transition sports support.

| 1. Provide opportunities for all children to participate in competitive sports. | The SSP provides opportunities to take part in a variety of sporting festivals within Bedford Borough. | £475 | Children across years 1-4 have had the opportunity to take part in a range of sporting festivals with other schools. This has helped to develop children's awareness of different sports, enhanced their enjoyment for sport, as well as developing self-confidence and social skills. The pupils have been keen to share their experiences of the competitions when returning back to school. |
| 2. Increase pupils' participation in physical activity across the school day. | Trim trail | £3518 | The purchase of the trim trail will encourage children to be physically active across more of the school day. It will also enhance children's balance, coordination, confidence and social skills. |
| 3. Improve the organisation of PE resources. | Storage units | £1,428.74 | The purchase of three new storage sheds has enabled PE resources to be separated between ks1, lower ks2 and upper ks2. This has made resources more accessible to staff, in turn increasing the use of this equipment within PE lessons. This has also ensured our PE resources are ready for our move to a primary school. |
| 4. Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport. | PE conference and PE specialist courses. | £145 | Attendance at PE courses has enabled the PE lead to keep up to date with current PE initiatives and legislation. This information gained from these courses has been shared with the head teacher and then disseminated to staff as and when appropriate. |
| 5. Enhance our PE resources to support learning and teaching in the subject. | Purchase new sports resources. | £450 | PE resources have been purchased throughout the year to ensure staff have the necessary equipment needed for their PE lessons, in turn aiding teaching and learning within PE. |
| 5. Broaden the range of sporting activities and experiences available to our pupils'. | Introduce a netball club for ks2 children. | | We are very fortunate that one of our parents is a qualified netball coach and offered to run an afterschool netball club free of charge, this meant our sports funding didn't need to be spent on this as planned. The club proved to be very popular. |
