

# **PE and Sports Grant**

## **Academic Year 2017 -2018**

### **Introduction**

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

### **Purpose of funding**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

### **Provision**

Following a self-review and a staff skills audit the following objectives have been agreed:

- Provide release time for our PE Subject Leader and other specialist trained staff to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across the school.
- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities.
- Improve our resources and facilities to support the development of the subject.
- Added resources and equipment to support Lower KS2 children in inter-competition activities and transition sports support.

It has also encouraged a wider breadth of sports to be taught.</p>

The SSP provides opportunities to take part in a variety of sporting festivals within Bedford Borough.	£755	<p>The children thoroughly enjoy participating in the sports festivals. It gives them the opportunity to try activities they haven't experienced before whilst also introducing them to the elements of competitive sports in a nurturing environment. They enjoy meeting children from other schools and develop in confidence as a result of the whole experience. These events help to raise the profile of PE and Sport across the school as the children come back buzzing, photographs are displayed on the PE board and certificates are presented within assembly.</p>
4. Further develop PE equipment and resources both for PE/Sport and physical activities.	Foundation Stage outside physical area.	£5831.68	<p>The new Foundation Stage outside area has provided children with continuous access to physical activity on a surface that can be used all year round. In turn this will contribute to the development of their gross motor skills, help to keep them healthy and set them up to participate in physical activity beyond Foundation Stage.</p>
