

PE and Sports Grant

Academic Year 2018 -2019

Introduction

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Provision

Following a self-review and a staff skills audit the following objectives have been agreed:

- To raise the profile of Physical Activity and to support and engage the least active children through Physical Activity opportunities.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Increase pupils' participation in sports and physical activities.
- Improve our resources and facilities to support the development of the subject.
- Added resources and equipment to support all pupils in sport, with an additional focus on KS2.
